

Greetings,

I'm Erik Ullestad, and from June 2003 to September 2015 I served as this congregation's Family Life & Youth Director. We first visited WHLC on our way from the Quad Cities, where Allison and I were living, to her hometown of Audubon on December 8, 2002. I had learned of a job opening in this congregation through my father, who was serving on the Augsburg Fortress board of directors with Pastor Richard Rehfeldt. Allison, pregnant with Anna at the time, and I slid in the back of the sanctuary to experience a "normal" Sunday service to see if this place was worth our consideration. During the sharing of the peace, a young man and his wife greeted us and asked, "Are you Erik?" I had the privilege of working with 5 called pastors and 3 interim pastors. Mission Trips to Jackson, MS and Mexico City gave way to ELCA Youth Gatherings and Pine Ridge trips. Five years of sporadic confirmation instruction morphed into 2.5 years of weekly instruction, which, for a while, was called Akaloo Wednesday, and eventually Wednesday Night at Church. Some programs were added. Others were removed. And even more has changed in the 4 years since we left this place. I thank God often that the Spirit continues to move through WHLC, propelling you to consider creative ways to use your resources of facility, money, and people. You're blessed with a tremendous staff, and I pray that you continue to love and support them the same way you loved and supported us.

This congregation will always be special to me and to our family. Our sons were baptized here. The likenesses of our children still hang on the wall outside the nursery. (And if you ever decide to decorate that space differently, we won't be offended.) Even the house we live in today has WHLC connections, as it was previously inhabited by the Basler and Boyken families. We will always be grateful for our time at Windsor Heights Lutheran. And though we have made meaningful connections and are enjoying life with our brothers and sisters at Capitol Hill Lutheran in the East Village, there is part of us which will always consider WHLC to be home.

And, to that point, I'll invite Allison to give you her update and fill you in on what's new with our family.

Because of WHLC, we have made life-long friendships, treasure many fond memories, and pray often for this community of faith. Anna was confirmed in 2017 at Capitol Hill Lutheran and remains heavily involved in the youth program and nursery activities there. Isaac is now 14 and will begin his freshman year at Valley Southwoods Freshman High School in the fall. He still plays basketball and hopes to make a top team this school year. Isaac ran cross country last year and very much enjoyed the comradery the sport provided. He still plays the trombone in the school band but after being in show choir last year has decided that his vocal talent is best suited for Southwoods Singers. Isaac works seasonally for the WDM Parks and Recreation Department as an adult sports scorekeeper.
