

"Gayla's Dishes"





But in the past decade, they have been sitting in the cupboards and used maybe once or twice. So, the decision was made to get rid of them so that space could be better used.

The opportunity was given to WHLC members if they wanted any of the sets. No one responded so they were listed on Facebook Marketplace. In one day, Linda Anderson received 15 inquiries for the dishes. The dishes were picked up on July 25.

Just a bit of history: the first call received was from Pastor Rehfeldt! His daughter, Ann, wanted a few sets that his wife, Cathy, used for many, many years of hosting receptions in

the parsonage. Pastor Rehfeldt said he remembered getting down on the floor reaching in the back of the cupboard for the dishes. Two dozen sets are packed ready for the journey to Minnesota!

There are also 50 sets going to New Mexico for a nieces wedding! A lady from a small church took some for the ladies to enjoy for special occasions. The last 50 went to a young couple who were pastors in Pleasant Hill transferring from youth ministry to couples and thought the dishes would be fun for their lady's events! June offerings were lower than budgeted offerings, however when considering the seasonal patterns of our offerings, we have received 108% of anticipated offerings. These lower monthly offerings are the primary reason for the net loss in the month of June. Expenses for the month of June were close to budgeted amounts. This includes quarterly payments for benevolence, which brings our total benevolence for the year to almost \$40,000. It also includes some expenses that occur one or two times a year, such as elm tree care and some kitchen maintenance.

WHLC remains on solid financial footing with working capital sufficient to meet our obligations.
