The Season of Home

Happy Holidays WHLC! As several of you know, this is my absolute favorite time of the year, when we revisit favorite carols, hang up colorful decor, recall cherished traditions and feel a sense of good cheer in the air. I like to share a reflection for the Window every December, each year focusing on a theme this season reminds me of. This year in particular, I find myself drawn towards the idea of home, and what that means for us as this year draws to a close.

For most of us, the thought of homes makes us think of buildings, the places where we live, or the spot we look forward to heading back to each night after a day at school, work or a trip away. While that's certainly true, it's interesting to note that $H\bar{a}m$, the original word our English word for "home" derives from, refers not to a physical building but rather a gathering of people. As I think of our church, and what the season of Advent means for all of creation, this idea of $H\bar{a}m$ seems not not only to fit the perfect picture of the season, but even highlight what this time of year is really about.

The classic saying goes that home is where your heart is, and that rings especially true around Christmastime every year. How many songs, movies and pictures reference the idea of being "home for the holidays,"? We can't deny there's a deeply powerful aspect to this idea. All the pictures of the holidays seem to return to families gathered together, gifts, food and cheer being shared, and everyone appreciating all that is around them. We all long to spend this time of year surrounded by the people who mean the most to us, and it doesn't feel quite right when we are not able to gather together for the most wonderful time of the year.

The more I ponder it, the whole concept seems to be the perfect idea of " $H\bar{a}m$ " put into practice. That's not to say the physical buildings don't matter, nor the locations where we gather. There is certainly plenty of tradition and festivity attached to them. Rather, it confirms that, for all of us, the idea of "home" we seek each holiday season is the people we love and are grateful for, and long to spend time with.

This same longing for $H\bar{a}m$ is found deeply woven into the Holy Nativity we approach this holiday season. Jesus enters the world not to be born in an iconic location, draped in royalty for the whole



world to see. Actually, the location seems to be far from the critical part of the narrative (though that's not to say it's not important!) Instead, the text focuses on who is surrounding Jesus as He is born. It seems to speak to the direct connection this new Messiah has to all of them; a young virgin mother, shepherds of the field, foreigners from another land, a host of heavenly glory and power, the first creatures God creates in the creation narrative.

The Scriptures make sure to mention all of them, tying them all into this powerful narrative. Because God does care about all of them, enough to long to be with them ... and the same holds true for us today. In this season we celebrate being at *Hām* with this new Messiah, who longs to be in relationship with all of creation, weaving a beautiful picture of how strong God's love is. And this love knows no stopping point or physical location-it abounds everywhere!

This season might find us all in different locations for the holidays, but wherever you and your family may be, and however you celebrate it, I hope you know the feeling of home wherever you are. That feeling won't erase struggles in our lives, or mean the road will always be easy ahead of us; what it does guarantee however, is that God is present alongside creation for every part of it. No matter where we are, home is right alongside us!

And as I ponder this feeling of home this holiday season, I think all of you, my beloved WHLC family. You all represent *home* every week; a gathering of people committed to living out God's wonderful love in this community of ours. I like to think that we each act as home to each other, and this church is just as much of a home to each of us. I am so grateful to share this special time of year with all of you, and pray that you all have a wonderful Holiday season.

Finally, to close this reflection, I'd like to leave a recommendation for a holiday song that fits this idea of *Hām*. As many of you know, I am a massive parrothead, as Jimmy Buffett has been my favorite artist for many years. His music, from my perspective at least, had a way of bringing all kinds of people together, creating a home for everyone to cast away worries and fears, and enjoy good company and good times. Sadly, Jimmy passed away this year, leaving many of us fans devastated to say goodbye to someone whose music made us feel at home wherever we we're. Music never dies however, and reflecting on one of his Christmas songs, "*Merry Christmas, Alabama*," has helped remind me of how wonderful this idea of *Hām* is.

If you have a chance this season, give it a listen! Maybe it will draw to mind where you find home to be in your life, and remind us all how we can celebrate it this holiday season. And maybe we all need a reminder of that when we feel a little exhausted, stressed, upset or confused. And wherever this season finds you, may you remember:

"That we're never, far from home,"

For the month of October General Offering was lower than budget and General Fund expenses were also lower than budget. While this resulted in a net loss for the month, we continue to have a strong year-to-date 2023 net income. Additionally Finance Committee monitors the patterns of income by month, vs the budget which assumes each month's income is one twelfth of the full year, and through October we are running more than 100% of what is anticipated.

Other General Fund Income consists of interest income, facility rental income and other miscellaneous income which in aggregate are coming in higher than what was budgeted.

The WHLC mortgage balance is now at \$646,401.03 vs \$705,752.36 at 12/31/2022.

Detailed financial statements are available in the Church Office. Please let me know if you have questions.




