


Dana Leahy's Advent and Christmas Pillar Designs

By now, most of you have noticed the familiar images and key words of the Christmas story that are wrapped around the three pillars at the south entrance of the church. WHLC Member Jim Spizale invited me to create what I call a revolving design for each of the three pillars that would allow the story to flow from each of the four sides of the three pillars. After accepting Jim's invitation, I drew the three designs (at 1/6 of the 8x8-foot scale) using pastels and glitter paint, scanned the images into my computer, added filters and type in separate programs and then sent the documents to Fast Signs, who created the weather-proof panels you see. Thanks to Jim and his never-ending creativity and expertise, the pieces were fitted and affixed to the pillars with zip ties and beautifully lit with an LED lighting system, also installed by Jim.

What an honor and joy it was to collaborate with Jim and to create works of art that celebrate and glorify the birth of our Lord and Savior Jesus.

While General Offerings were down in November relative to October and to Budget, when based upon 2020-2022 income patterns, General Fund Income should have been around \$436,546 versus actual General Fund Income of \$449,415, which is more than 102% of expected. We know that income does not come in uniformly throughout the year and the Finance Committee regularly monitors our income and expenses to make sure we have no items of concern.

Year-to-date General Fund Expenses are running \$17,671 below budget. Some of these are items that are only paid quarterly and will 'catch up' in December, such as many of our benevolence items. Some of the line items contributing to the more permanent lower-than-budgeted expenses include snow removal (where we entered into a new contract during 2023), as well as some expenses we budgeted for the time of transition from two pastors to one. Parish Ed expenses are also below budget, thanks in large part to the ability of our staff and volunteers to efficiently provide awesome programming. In compiling the 2024 Budget the Finance Committee continues to work towards being prepared for all programming and other financial needs of our congregation.

We are extremely blessed to be in a strong position. Thank you for your continued support of WHLC financially, prayerfully and with your time & talents.
