A SPECIAL MESSAGE ABOUT OUR EASTER BREAKFAST FUNDRAISER

Easter is right around the corner this month, and that means the return of our annual Easter Breakfast! As many of you know, this is a yearly fundraiser that's run by the youth group, and is a way to raise money for the group. This year, however, is a bit of a special year for this fundraising event, and I wanted to take a minute here to explain why.

While the money gathered from this fundraiser is gathered into our Youth Permanent Fund, which covers youth related events, it was originally created to really help cover one big, seminal event for Lutheran students: The ELCA's National Youth Gathering. This event occurs only once every three years, and due to logistical and safety problems linked to the pandemic, it hasn't been hosted since 2018, which is the last time WHLC sent a group to the event.

That all has changed this summer however, as the event will return to New Orleans for an amazing week from July 16-20, where over 20,000 students and churches from all over the whole world will gather to worship, serve, build community and learn how they can play a critical role in the global church. I'm so happy to share that WHLC has a group of 10 congregants attending this event: Matt, Stephanie, Michael and Makenna McNamara, Megan, Ryenn and Harper Seifert, Amanda Eakins, Lucy Valin, and myself. This is an incredible group of students and volunteers that are already so excited for this incredible week!

As you can imagine, sending 10 people down to New Orleans for a week like this takes a ton of logistic planning and many expenses. WHLC has been blessed to help front some of the big costs for the trip, including covering half the cost of registration for each participant, as well as the entirety of our travel flight fees from Des Moines to New Orleans and back. We were happy to do this as a church, as we had accrued some spare funds to use over the years while the event was on hiatus.

However, there is still plenty more for us to cover, and a large chunk of the Permanent Youth fund to refill and use for this event; that's where the Easter Breakfast comes in. This event will act as one of our major (but certainly not only) fundraisers to raise money to cover expenses on the trip. Our Gathering group will be taking an extremely hands-on approach to planning and hosting these events, as we work as a team to raise funds while offering some great things to the congregation and community!

This year, perhaps more so than any other, this breakfast is a powerful chance for us to connect fundraising to our youth ministry. It's a great opportunity for our students to experience and model service, while providing something everyone likes (hey, what Lutheran doesn't enjoy a large community meal?) On the reverse side, it's a great opportunity for us as a congregation to come together to support these students in attending a once in a lifetime event. The National Youth Gathering is unlike any other event in the ELCA, and really is one of those mountain-top moments for so many of our younger congregants in the larger church.

I guess that's the long way of saying that, we'd be grateful for your help, donations and support as we return to this beloved fundraiser. Any donation, no matter how large or small, would be of great assistance. This is a great cause, and event, to rally around, and we're so excited the students can personally engage in supporting their trip through serving this breakfast.

If you would like to assist but won't be there on Easter Sunday, we will once again be offering the "take and fill" casserole pans that we serve at the breakfast. You'll find these pans in the narthex, color coded to each casserole. Simply take one, fill it with the ingredients listed, and bring it back to church for us to bake and serve on Easter Sunday! Individual checks and monetary donations can also be put in the church drop box. Please write "permanent youth fund" in the memo line if you write a check.

We hope to see you there on Easter Sunday for a great time of food and fellowship in Crabtree Parish Hall. Come on out and support our young students as they prepare for one of the most incredible weeks they'll ever experience!






You Did It! Thank You!

My prayers are for their wellbeing and for the brave folks who are there helping them, that they continue to be strong and not give up hope.



In January Windsor Heights received a second distribution from the Crabtree estate. This distribution of more than \$94,000 is reflected in the Capital Appeal Permanent Fund balance shown above and in February will be used to further reduce the mortgage balance. All gifts made to the Capital Appeal Permanent Fund have allowed us to make significant progress towards paying off the mortgage balance. We are grateful for all who have continued to make occasional gifts as well as ongoing regular gifts. The ministries we can offer as a result of the remodeled and updated building are a blessing to many.

January 2024 General Fund Expenses were \$4,390 below budget. Most of this variance is due to the timing of expense payment vs when the expenses are budgeted. Expenses such as insurance, or non-ELCA benevolence payments are budgeted monthly, but disbursed quarterly, causing variances in monthly financial statements which 'catch up' as the year progresses.

While general offerings for January are significantly below budget, we know that giving patterns are not uniform throughout the year for a variety of reasons. As such, we anticipate general offerings will approach budget levels as 2024 continues. If you are looking for a way to automate your giving, we encourage you to investigate the Simply Giving program which offers the opportunity to have one-time or recurring giving directly to WHLC. You can find a link to this program on the WHLC website.

The Finance Committee actively reviews the financials of WHLC routinely and makes recommendations as appropriate. WHLC remains on solid financial footing with working capital sufficient to meet our obligations.
