

## Get to Know About the Upcoming ELCA Youth Gathering, and Our Group that Is Going!

You may have noticed, as we prepared for the Easter breakfast these past few weeks, quite a bit of talk about the upcoming ELCA National Youth Gathering. I'm grateful to our pastors and congregants for spreading the word about this event, and how the church has come together to support the group we are sending! You may have heard a bit about why this event is so critical, but with the Gathering being only four months away, we figured it might be a good time to share more information on this powerful event!

Ever since 1988, the ELCA has hosted this large gathering of students from various ELCA churches across not only the U.S., but the entire world. For five days, students come together in the host city to see how they fit into the larger picture of the work God is doing throughout the church. They'll learn about ministries the ELCA is partaking in, hear from different speakers and organizations, explore potential challenges they may face in their faith and in the world, and partake in work that serves the community. It's a mountaintop and life-changing experience for so many, as several previous attendees from WHLC could tell you!

This summer's Gathering will be in New Orleans from July 16-20 (our group will have an extended stay from July 15-21). This will be the third time the event has been hosted in NOLA, but this Gathering might be even more critical than the last one that met there, back in 2012. That's because the Gathering has not gathered together in six years, due to the outbreak of the pandemic back in 2020 and the subsequent fallout. Much has changed in that time, and the young students in our ELCA churches, in many ways, face a very different world compared to what it was even just a few years ago.

With all of that in mind, the Gathering team has adapted, and everyone is super excited to meet again this summer. It'll be such an incredible chance for all these young students to see what they are a part of, and just how much of an important role they play in the ELCA's future! I know our group is really excited to go to this event, and is already exploring the ways their faith will be expanded by this experience.

Speaking of our group, how about we get to know them a little better? We have five students and five adult volunteers (including myself) attending this event, and its been exciting to watch them all come together. The five students attending, Ryenn and Harper Seifert, Michael and Makenna McNamara and Lucy Eakins are names familiar to most of you, as they're a fixture at worship, Wednesday activities, helping with VBS and so much more. They are an energetic group, and this will be the first time for any of them attending The Gathering!

One aspect I really find cool, and a little unique about our group is that the remaining adult volunteers (apart from myself) are parents of the students attending! Megan Seifert, Stephanie and Matt McNamara, and Amanda Eakins will also be joining us during our week in New Orleans, to experience this week alongside their kids. When I was a student attending the Gathering in '09 and '12, I was fortunate to have my own mom volunteer as an adult leader for the group, and to this day it was such a memorable experience to share with her. While the event is geared towards the students, for the volunteers the week is just as special and moving in so many ways. It's really a blessing to see these families supporting their students by taking this amazing trip together!

The Easter Breakfast we hosted the other week, along with the March Madness Bracket Pool we did, were the first fundraisers we hosted to help raise money for this group to attend the Gathering. We've got a couple of more fundraisers planned for the next few months prior to July, so be on the lookout as our students continue to find fun ways to raise money for this big trip!

WHLC has been very blessed to cover quite a bit of the expenses for each of the students and volunteers attending The Gathering, including the costs of travel, housing and half the cost of everyone's registration. We we're grateful to have quite a bit of funds built up over the past six years to cover this, but as you can imagine, there's still other cost that need to be met, and we are hoping to replenish the current funds we are using so future youth gathering groups can have the same coverage this year's group does! Any monetary donations made out to the Permanent Youth Fund would be so greatly appreciated by our group.

Finally, I just want to take a moment to thank all of you for your support, well wishes, and prayers for this group as we prepare for this amazing week in July! I know it

means so much to our students and their families to have so much love and support from this congregation, and we're excited to represent WHLC on this trip. We'll continue to keep all of you up to date as we get closer to the Gathering, and share the many ways in which we are preparing as a group. Again, thank you all for all of your support, we couldn't make this possible without all of you!

## WHAT DOES IT TAKE TO HOST A FUNERAL LUNCH?




If you have not attended a funeral lunch at WHLC for awhile we would like to share with you what goes on behind the scene!! It took a few days/hours of contacting WHLC members for the three funeral luncheons that were hosted during the Easter season.

In total we served 280 sandwiches (from Hy-Vee), 30 salads, 38 pans of bars and 40 people helped with the set up, serving, cleanup and laundry. Many members volunteer before we even make a call as soon as a funeral is announced.

## GAS STOVE IN KITCHEN



Please follow these directions that are posted in the kitchen when using the gas stove:

### If the gas oven does not turn on...

- 1.Make sure the switch on the far left side is set to ON (NEVER turn it to OFF)
- 2.If that doesn't fix the problem, open the panel at the bottom of the oven
- 3. You'll see a button (that's the pilot light) and a knob (labeled on, off & pilot)
- 4. Turn the knob to "pilot" while pushing the pilot button to start the oven.

General Offerings in February improved from January, and when combined with interest on a CD that was paid in February, General Fund Income was strong. While year-to-date Geneal Offerings are below Budget, as we have seen in previous years, we expect them to approach budget levels as the year continues.

February 2023 General Fund Expenses were slightly higher than budget, though expenses are less than budget year-to-date and are very consistent with 2023 expenses. This pattern is normal and reflects that the budget expense patterns are level monthly while the payment of expenses varies from month to month on several items such as insurance and benevolence.

The balance of the mortgage is now under \$535,000. Members continue to make offerings to the Capital Appeal Permanent Fund, for this we are truly blessed.

WHLC remains on solid financial footing with working capital sufficient to meet our obligations.
