## WHLC Quilters' 1,000th Quilt!



An exciting day for our church family when we reached our 1,000<sup>th</sup> quilt for Lutheran World Relief!

Linda Anderson began photographing our quilt "production" in 2013 and with the help of many individuals in the church, number 1,000 was finished.

Sheets have been washed and donated for use as backs, kits have been cut to make assembling tops as easy as possible, in addition to the kits, many tops have been put together with fabric that the maker had on hand. The church has paid for the batting and shipping. Hope Lutheran quilters received more fabric than they needed and shared 25 bolts of fabric for our use. We have lots of donated fabric to be cut, so if you are not into kits but don't have fabric of your own to use, contact me and I will share fabric with you.

The important thing when making these quilts is to use a ½ in seam instead of the ¼ inch seam we usually use when make quilts. This makes for a stronger seam. And of course the size is 60x80 inches, as the method used to pack and ship them scrunches them into bales for shipping and that is the size the baler uses to pack them into containers.

A quilter from a church that does not have a quilting program loves to sew and felt compelled

to make quilts for the overwhelming need of refugees. She makes tops and donates them to us to tie and ship.

Thanks to all of you who have helped with this outreach program. As always, we need a few more helpers to tie quilts on Monday morning, 9:30 to 11:30.



Offerings were below budget in March; however it is important to note that the last Sunday of the month was March 31, and offering from that weekend will be reflected in the April statements. Although we are still below budget for the year, we expect the General Offerings to approach budget levels as the year continues.

Like all quarter-ends, March 2024 General Fund Expenses include the quarterly Benevolence payments. Overall, year-to-date expenses are coming in lower than budgeted. In addition to the normal seasonality of expenses, a portion of this favorable variance is in the Buildings and Grounds category, much of which is due to our cleaning bill for March not arriving until April, meaning that will catch up next month. However, with Building and Grounds and many other expense categories, careful expense management without sacrificing programming is keeping our overall expenses under control.

In April another Certificate of Deposit for \$108,000 will mature and be up for review. This CD has been earning 4.25% and interest rates are currently higher than that, so we will be able to improve that rate when we renew.

WHLC remains on solid financial footing with working capital sufficient to meet our obligations.
